In March 2015, the program director and I applied for a Faculty International Development Grant from the Office of International Programs for \$1600 and received funding to visit and evaluate our potential clinical rotation in Trujillo, Peru.

In addition to the HRSA grant that the PA program has to facilitate our student engaged medical clinic, our Program Director applied and received extra funding for a conference on Opioids as well as funding for our students to complete MAT training. I helped to educate and facilitate our students doing MAT training as part of this grant. In conjunction with our Program Director, I helped

in the implementation of the Opioid Conference held spring 2019. I assisted in advertising and bringing in JMU PA alumni to the event as well as helped with registration at the event.

In March 2022, applied and was awarded the PA Foundation Global Outreach Grant with Blake Rogers, PA-C. This grant allows our student to travel to Shirati, Tanzania with a portable ultrasound machine and teach bedside ultrasound techniques to local staff.
